1. **Dress code for the dairy show that must be followed is white pants and a 4-H/FFA shirt. A 4-H armband is allowed. Caps are not allowed.**
2. **EXHIBITORS WITH A DAIRY ANIMAL MUST BE FOOD SAFETY QUALITY ASSURANCE (FSQA) CERTIFIED.**
3. Entries are open to all dairy heifers and cows that have been enrolled as 2011 Story County Dairy projects.
4. Dairy calves must be sired by a registered purebred bull.
5. Straightbred dairy animal is one that was produced from a sire and dam of the same breed. It may or may not be registered, but if registered, papers must be presented to the Department Superintendent before the show. Breed of all dairy animals must be listed on the entry blank. See Rule 4.
6. All heifers must either be registered, tattooed or tagged to assure individual identification. This individual identification must be shown on the 4-H Dairy Animal Identification form by May 15, 2011.
7. Exhibitor may enter up to six (6) dairy heifers or cows of which not more than two (2) may be entered in any one age lot per breed.
8. Straight bred and Crossbred heifers will show separately in age lots as follows:

Junior Calf -	Born after February 28, 2011
Intermediate Calf -	December 1, 2010-February 28, 2011
Senior Calf-	September 1, 2010-November 30, 2010
Summer Yearling -	June 1, 2010 – August 31, 2010
Junior Yearling-	March 1, 2010 – May 31, 2010
Winter Yearling-	December 1, 2009-February 29, 2010
Senior Yearling-	September 1, 2009-November 30, 2009
Two Year Old-	September 1, 2008 -August 31, 2009
Three Year Old-	September 1, 2007-August 31, 2008
Four Year Old-	September 1, 2006 - August 31, 2007
Aged Cow-	Before September 1, 2006 or older
9. The Dairy Cow Class is open to any dairy cow born before September 1, 2008, which has previously been enrolled in 4-H/FFA as a calf, yearling or two year old.
10. The Dairy Herd shall consist of three (3) animals, all one breed, owned by one exhibitor. One (1) group per exhibitor. All animals must be entered and shown in the individual classes.
11. No heifers or cows will be allowed to go home early.
12. No coloring or painting of dairy animals is allowed except for hooves. If this rule is not followed, it may result in disqualification of the exhibit.
