Refer to General Rules and Health Rules for additional information.

1. a. **Only dogs identified on the Dog Identification Report by May 15, 2011 may exhibit at the Story County Fair.**

b. Only dogs enrolled in the Story County 4-H Dog Project are eligible to be shown by 4-H/FFA members. Dog entries are due the same date as other fair entries.

2. All dogs must be on leash. Dogs must not be taken near other livestock or into exhibit buildings on the fairgrounds.

3. Dogs will not be housed at the fairgrounds. They are to be brought and returned home on show day.

4. Dogs must have a current rabies and distemper vaccination. Exhibitors must have a veterinarian's certificate with them showing the dates of immunization.

5. An Exhibitor may win showmanship one time only in each of the three grade divisions.

6. To win a purple ribbon in a Pre-Novice class or the Sub-Novice class, a dog must score 150-160 points.

To win a blue ribbon in a Pre-Novice class or the Sub-Novice class, a dog must score 130 – 149 points. There is a total of 160 maximum points in the Pre-Novice and the Sub-Novices classes.

7. To win a purple ribbon in any class except Pre-Novice or Sub-Novice class and showmanship, a dog must score 190-200 points. The maximum points that can be earned are 200. To win a blue ribbon in any class except Pre-Novice or Sub-Novice class and showmanship, a dog must score 170-189 points.

8. Classes are listed in order of novice to advanced. Dog and handlers advance in class. Once a dog **and** handler have advanced in class, they cannot enter a less advanced class.

9. No coloring or painting of dogs. If this rule is not followed, it may result in disqualification of the exhibit.

10. Description of classes:

Pre-Novice A - For dogs and exhibitors in the first year of dog obedience training. Dogs will be judged on their ability to heel on leash, stand for examination on leash, sit, and stay for one minute, and stay down for three minutes on leash. Recall will be on leash unless otherwise indicated. Dogs cannot have an AKC C. D. or UKC C.D. degree prior to the fair.

Pre-Novice B - For dogs in first year of dog obedience training and exhibitors that have completed more than one year of obedience training. Exercises are the same as in Pre-Novice A class. Dogs cannot have AKC C. D. or UKC C.D. degree prior to the fair.

Sub-Novice - For dogs and handlers in second year, who are not ready for off leash heeling. Dogs will heel on leash only, stand for examination off leash, recall off leash, sit and stay for one minute off leash, and stay down for three minutes off leash. Dogs may be entered in either sub-novice or Novice A, **but not both!** Dogs entered in this class may not be entered in Pre-Novice A or Pre-Novice B classes. Handlers and dogs must not have an AKC C.D. or UKC C.D. degree.

Novice A - For dogs and handlers in second year of training. Dogs will heel on and off leash, stand for examination off leash, recall off leash, sit for one minute, and stay down for three minutes off leash. Dogs entered in this class may not be entered in Pre-Novice A, Pre-Novice B, or Sub Novice classes. Handlers and dogs must not have an AKC C.D. or UKC C.D. degree.

Novice B - For dogs in second year and handlers in third year or more or for those who participated in the Sub-Novice Class the year before. Exercises same as in Novice A class. Dogs entered in this class may not be entered in any previous class. Dogs must not have an AKC C.D. or UKC C.D. degree.

Graduate Novice A - For dogs in the third year of dog obedience training or dogs and handlers in the 4th year who showed in Novice B the year before. **Dogs will heel ON leash, excluding the Figure 8 which will be OFF leash. Drop on recall, the dumbbell recall, recall over the high jump, and recall over the broad jump. The long down for 3 minutes with the handlers out of sight. Dogs entered in this class may not be entered in Pre-Novice A or B, Sub-Novice as well as Novice A or B classes. Handlers and dogs must not have an AKC C.D.X. or UKC C.D.X. degree.**

Graduate Novice B - For dogs in fourth year or more of dog obedience training. Exercises same as Graduate Novice A class. Dogs must not have an AKC C.D.X. or UKC C.D.X. degree.

Open - Dogs will heel off leash, drop on recall, retrieve on the flat and over the high jump, broad jump, and do a **sit stay for 3 minutes and a down stay for 5 minutes with the handler out of sight.** Dogs entered in this class may not be entered in Pre-Novice A, Pre-Novice B, Sub-Novice, Novice A or Novice B classes.

Graduate Open – Dogs and handlers in their 5th year or more of dog training, who have successfully competed in the open classes. Signal exercise, scent discrimination, directed retrieve, moving stand and exam, go out, and directed jumping.

Challenge Novice - For dogs and handlers in second year or more. Dogs entered in this class may not be entered in pre-novice or sub-novice classes, but may be entered in Novice A, Novice B, Graduate Novice A, Graduate Novice B, open or utility. Winner of this class is not eligible for Highest or Reserve Highest Scoring Dog in show.
