### Derby Pig Program

Explanation: The Derby Pig Show focuses on the performance and carcass merit of market pigs. A beginning test weight is taken on each pig. At County Fair pigs are weighed and an "on test rate-of-gain" is determined. The on-test rate of gain is used in a formula with live animal ultrasonic estimates of carcass merit. Pigs are ranked according to the LGOT. The Derby Show at fair has two aspects: the lean gain on test and placing (discussed above); and a live show ring placing. In the live show, pigs are placed in classes according to the beginning on test weight. Judging will be through visual placing and rate-of-gain information.

### Rules

1. Exhibitor eligibility requirements are found in General Rules.
2. All swine must be ear notched according to the Universal Swine Ear Notching System.
3. All swine must meet the health requirements as listed in the Health Requirements section of this book. Swine exhibitors must sign an affidavit that swine dysentery has not been in evidence in the home herd for the past 12 months. Forms will be available at the scale for exhibitors to sign.
4. All swine including the champions and reserve champions must be slaughtered. Once your trailer enters the Fair Grounds, swine, unloaded or not, will not be allowed home.
5. **All swine must be made available for the livestock-judging contest.**
6. Weighing/scanning will be done Saturday morning, July 23. Times will be posted. All derby pigs will be scanned and are eligible for the Gilt and Barrow Lean Gain on Test.
7. **Exhibitors may show a maximum of 6 pigs in the Swine Division.** There will be a Derby Show and a Market Show. Any combination of barrows or gilts may be shown. Exhibitors must have 4 derby pigs to be eligible for the Group of 4 Lean Gain on Test Class. **You may bring a maximum of 3 Market Pigs.**
8. The judge and show officials will have the authorization to disqualify any pigs that are severely unsound or exhibit any of the following abnormalities: pigs with serious injury, evidence of stress susceptibility, other defects or abnormalities and structurally unsound pigs. Any barrow displaying boar characteristics will be disqualified from the live show and the carcass contest.
9. All swine must be exhibited and placed in the live show for competition in the carcass contest.
10. Derby pigs must have been tattooed and weighed at a county weigh site on April 16. Maximum derby weight per pig on April 16 is 60 pounds, with a maximum of 70 lbs for market pigs. Pigs over 70 lbs at the weigh in will not be weighed. There is no minimum weight for derby pigs at the fair, but anything under 220 pounds will likely be docked considerably in marketing.
11. **\*\*Market pigs must weigh between 230-290 pounds at the fair or they cannot be exhibited.\*\***

### Herdsmanship

1. Exhibitors are expected to have feed/water available to animals by 8:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. each day of the fair.
2. Only wood chips will be allowed for bedding.
3. No "Bulk" feeders or large water tanks will be allowed. It is recommended that feed pans be in pens only at feeding time.
